Re: Covid-19 Return to School and Response Plan – ACTION REQUIRED

### Dear KNPS Parents and Students:

I hope this email find you safe and healthy and that your summer has gone well during these unique times. In just over a month, we will return to school for the 2020-2021 school year, and it goes without saying that there is a wide range of opinions and emotions about how that should occur. Knob Noster Public Schools places safety as a top priority. As we continue to embrace the Covid-19 pandemic, the district is working to provide an environment that is as safe and as normal as possible for our students, teachers, and community.

As Knob Noster Public Schools transitions into the 2020-2021 school year, there are many unknowns. However, in the midst of uncertainty, the district knows that families and communities need schools to be ready to reopen as soon as possible with guidance from local, state and national agencies. This is a moment when all of us—educators, families, and communities—must unite to ensure that children reenter schools with safety as a top priority so that learning can continue and students can develop the academic, social and emotional experiences necessary for their growth. These past several months have served as a great reminder of the role that public schools play in ensuring equitable education and support services for all students.

Attached to this memo is the KNPS Covid-19 Return to School and Response Plan. This plan is expected to evolve as new information is received. This plan should answer many questions you may have. In addition, the plan provides the following educational options, so that you may select the educational plan that works best for you.

#### **SNAPSHOT PREVIEW**

In an effort to respond to the full scope of considerations of the Covid-19 pandemic, including student education and service concerns, parental employment concerns, economic recovery concerns, political concerns, national security concerns, and a variety of other considerations, the following options will be provided this year as components of our return to school plan. In attempt to meet the various preferences and situations of our students, families and community, parents will be able to choose their educational format from one of the options below:

#### In-Person Education\*\*

KNPS will offer a traditional format where students will come to school and learn in a face to face environment with their teacher and peers with a schedule that closely aligns to a routine school year. Additional safeguards which will be provided to minimize risk are described later in this document. Students choosing this option would switch to remote learning if/when a quarantine or shutdown occurs as described later in this document.

#### **Online Virtual Education**

KNPS will offer a 100% virtual learning option for students. For grades 6-12, this will be provided through the Knob Noster Virtual Academy Powered by Edmentum's Ed Options Academy. For grades K-5, the district may also use the Knob Noster Virtual Academy OR may place the student in a cohort group (single or multiple grade level) with instruction provided by a Knob Noster teacher. The district's delivery method will depend on the number of students choosing this option. A student choosing this option will be required to remain with this option for the entire semester. ## **MOCAP**

KNPS will offer 100% virtual learning options through the Missouri Course Access and Virtual School Program (MOCAP). #### **Homeschool Education**

Parents reserve the right to homeschool students. Once a student is registered for homeschooling a letter with the intent to homeschool and the drop date for the student must be submitted to the child's school office.

\*\*Knob Noster Public Schools may exercise a partial, intermittent, or full closure due to the health status of our school, community, or region. In this instance, the district will immediately shift to virtual learning options though our Alternative Methods of Instruction Extended (AMIX) Plan.
